Language of instruction: *Russian (the programme requires proficiency in Russian at least at the elementary level (A1)).*

Programme description: *This programme is designed for foreign nationals who plan to use the Russian language in their career. The career prospects for graduates of the programme include: knowledge in philology and humanities, interpersonal, intercultural and mass communication in oral, written and virtual form, business communication. Students will study languages in their theoretical and practical aspects; business communication and business etiquette; and different types of texts; oral, written and virtual communication.*

Graduates of this programme can:

- *carry out intercultural interaction in business using knowledge on the theory of intercultural communication, knowledge of the official business style of Russian language, linguistic support of all types of speech in Russian in a business environment*
- *carry out research using the knowledge of the conceptual apparatus of philology, methods of collection and analysis of linguistic material, methods of empirical research in the field of theory and practice of intercultural communication*
